

Sailing Instructions (SI)

1. Rules

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).

2. Changes to the Sailing Instructions

- 2.1 Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted on the official notice board at [SM ILCA Master 2023 - EMS Sweden 2023 \(sailarena.com\)](https://www.sailarena.com) before 08:00 on the day it will take effect.
- 2.2 Any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 20:00 on the day before it will take effect.

3. Signals made ashore

- 3.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed on the flag pole at the club house.
- 3.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 60 minutes' in RRS Race Signals.

4. The start

- 4.1 Time for the First warning signal on Saturday will be 11:00 and on Sunday 10:00.
On the last day of racing no warning signal will be made after 15:00
- 4.2 Class flag
ILCA 7 - White
ILCA 6 - Green

4.3 To alert boats that a new starting sequence is about to begin, the orange flag on the starting line will be displayed with a sound signal not less than five minutes before the warning signal.

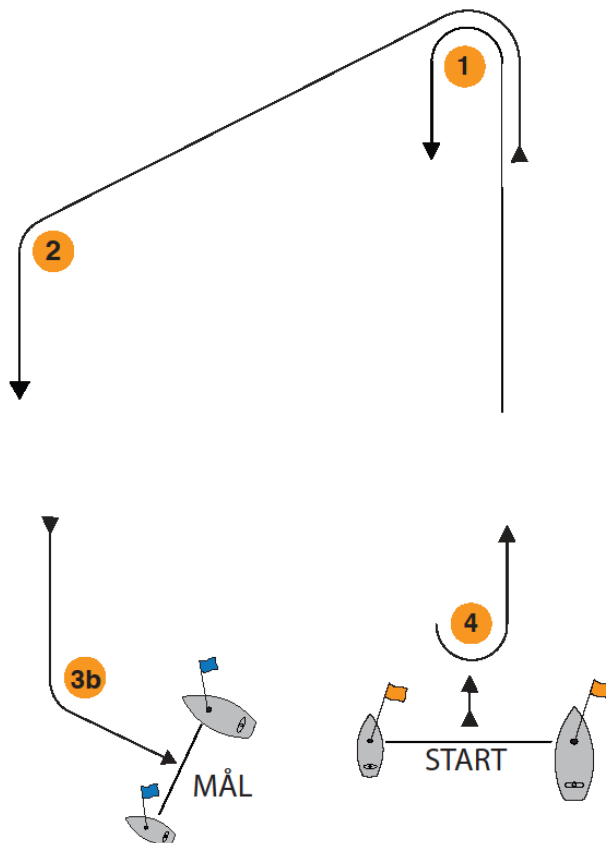
4.4 A boat that does not start within five minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start (DNS) without a hearing. This changes RRS A5.1 and A5.2.

5. The course

5.1 The starting line is between a staff displaying an orange flag on the race committee vessel at the starboard end and the course side of the port-end starting mark.

5.2 The diagram below shows the course, the order in which marks are to be passed and the side of which each mark is to be left.

ILCA 6 inner loop – Start – 1 – 4 – 1 – 2 – 3b – Finish
ILCA 7 outer loop - Start – 1 – 2 – 3b – 2 – 3b - Finish



5.3 The finishing line is between a staff displaying a blue flag on the race committee vessel and the course side of the finishing mark.

- 5.4 The race committee will try to set the course so that a race will take approximately 45-60 minutes for the first boat.
- 5.5 The time limit for the first boat to sail the course is 90 minutes.
- 5.6 A boat that does not finish within 15 minutes after the first boat has finished, will be scored Did Not Finish (DNF). This changes RRS 35.

6. Protests and requests for hearings

- 6.1 Protests and requests for hearings shall be filed at the race office within the protest time limit and comply with the requirements of RRS 61.2.
- 6.2 The protest time limit is 30 minutes after the last boat finishes the last race of the day or the race committee signals no more racing today, whichever is later.
- 6.3 Notices will be posted no later than 30 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses, including time and place for the hearing.
