Sailing Instructions (SI)

Dates: August 22–24, 2025

Location: Ystad

Class: KLM 2025 Waszp Junior open

1. Rules

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- 1.2 Flag D displayed ashore with one sound means 'The warning signal will be made no less than 40 minutes after flag D is displayed. Boats shall not leave their berth until this signal is made. Flag D will be displayed together with the identification of the assigned race area.
- 1.3 When the whole fleet is not foiling for more than 20 seconds the race shall be abandoned.

2. Changes to the Sailing Instructions

- 2.1 Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted on the official noticeboard at Sailarena before 08:00 on the day it will take effect.
- 2.2 Any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 20:00 on the day before it will take effect.

3. Signals made ashore

- 3.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed on the flagpole outside the club house.
- 3.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'no less than 40 minutes' in RRS Race Signals.

5. The start

5.1 First warning signal of the day is described in NoR.

Class flag and type of racing Waszp.

Racing type	Flag
Course racing	Red
Slalom racing	Green
Class flagg	Waszp flag

5.2 RRS 26 is changed as follows:

Minutes before	Visual signal	Sound	Means
the start		signal	
5	Classflag, Red/green flag, black flag, sign flag 2 or 3.	One	Race committee ready
3	Flags with numbers 1 1	One	Warning signal
2	Flags with numbers 2 1	One	Preparatory signal
1	Flag with number	One long	One minute
0	All flags down.	One	Starting signal


- 5.3 To alert Board/boats that a new starting sequence is about to begin, the orange flag on the starting line will be displayed with a sound signal not less than five minutes before the start signal.
- 5.4 A board/boat that does not start within three minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start (DNS) without a hearing. This changes RRS A5.1 and A5.2.


6. The course, course racing, slalom racing, speed racing

- 6.1 The starting line is between a staff displaying an orange flag on the race committee vessel at the starboard end and the port-end starting mark.
- 6.2 There are two alternative courses: Course racing or Slalom racing.

Course racing.


The diagram below shows the course, the order in which marks are to be passed and the side of which each mark is to the left. The course is to be sailed Start – mark 1s/1b – marks 4s/4b – mark 1s/1b – finish, or Start – mark 1s/1b – marks 4s/4b – mark 1s/1b – marks 4s/4b – mark 1s/1b – finish (signal flag 2 means 2 laps, signal flag 3 means 3 laps). The rounding marks are yellow buoys. Start and the finishing line is between the orange flag at the race committee vessel and an orange flag on the finishing mark.





Slalom racing.

The diagram below shows the course, the order in which marks are to be passed and the side of which each mark is to be left. The course is to be sailed (1 lap): Start - 1 - 2 - 3 - Finish. The rounding marks are yellow buoys.



6.3 The finishing line is between a staff displaying a blue flag on a race committee vessel and the finishing mark.

6.4 Time limits

Course	Target time	Time limit	Finish window
Course racing	15	24	14
Slalom Sprint	4	10	7

6.5 Boats that do not finish the time window after the first boat has finished, will be scored Did Not Finish (DNF). This changes RRS 35.

7. Racing format

7.1 A Ground series (10 races) and Grand final are planned.

The Grand final will be sailed by the top 3 sailors ranked in the Ground series. If there are protests during the last day of sailing the final score will become the result without the Grand final race. Information will be on the official noticeboard and on a board on the starting vessel. Information will also be communicated to the top 3 sailors on the water.

8. Protests and requests for hearings

- 8.1 Protests shall immediately be reported after the passage of the finish line to the race committee boat.
- 8.2 Protests that have not been managed on the water must file a formal protest after the last board/boat finishes the last race of the day or the race committee signals no more racing today, whichever is later. Protest time ends 15 minutes after the last boat enters the harbor and is on shore.
- 8.3 Notices will be posted no later than 30 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses, including time and place for the hearing. Call for hearing may also be e-mailed to the parties.
